

Our Club Captain Pete Roden finished up by giving a great analogy on how, as life savers we are taught to look out for and watch for signs of danger whilst on patrol and then take the appropriate action and how the same can be said about looking after our own mental health and that of those around us.

We had over 30 club members and parents attend the presentation with everyone leaving having gained something valuable from the afternoon - prooving it was well worth the effort and time to organise and facilitate an event of this nature. JE: Mineral water or anything soft.


What do you enjoy most about Macs?


