## President's Report continued

#### **BOARD DECISION ON MEMBERSHIP FEES**

At the July meeting of the Board of Directors it was resolved that the following new clause will replace Clause 12 of Part 2 of the By-Laws as recommended by SLSNSW. This will bring our essential governing provisions into line with modern requirements and those of SLSA.

Membership renewals are now due for the current year in accordance with the resolution below. Renewal is required to be able to attend and vote at the upcoming AGM on Sunday 19th August at the club at 4.00pm.

Membership renewal can be paid via our online portal - click on the Donation or Payment tab on our website.

#### 1. SUBSCRIPTIONS [as adopted by the board of Directors on 18 July 2018]

- (a) The annual membership subscription is (until determined otherwise by the Board):
  - (i) All categories of Membership excluding Nippers and Associates \$55 00
  - (ii) Nippers: (A
- (A) U6 & U7 \$50.00 per child
  - (B) U8 to U14 (Note: these fees DO NOT include the State Carnival)
  - (C) 1st Child \$100 / 2nd Child \$80 / 3rd Child \$70
  - (iii) Associates \$55.00.

#### Notes:

- 1. U8-U14 Nippers also need to purchase the club skull cap and pink vest. These are necessary for safety on our beach. For competing nippers, the club swimming costume must be purchased also. U6 & U7 Nippers must purchase the pink vest.
- 2. Parental membership is encouraged to enable parental involvement with age groups. Parents are encouraged to join (Associate or Patrolling membership). This means that the parent is covered by the Club's insurance.
- (b) The Club Membership Year is the 12 months from 1st of May of a year, to 30th of April of the next year.
- (c) Membership renewal is due from 1st of May each year and should be paid prior to the commencement of patrols in that year.

#### **BOARD DECISION ON MEMBERSHIP FEES continued**

- (d) Members who are not financial or qualified are not to participate in any club activities including training, competition, patrols.
- (e) No member shall be entitled to be elected to office or permitted to vote until fees for the ensuing season, together with any arrears due, have been paid.
- (f) Any member failing to pay their subscription by 31 December in any year shall not be entitled to any privileges of the club so long as the subscription shall remain in arrears and at the discretion of the Board. If the arrears are not paid by that date, membership may be terminated.
- (g) No person financially indebted to any other affiliated club of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia shall knowingly be admitted to membership.

#### NOTICE of BUSINESS for the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

To be held on Sunday 19th August 2018 at 4.00pm at the Clubhouse

#### BUSINESS:

To consider the election of Peter Roden the Director of Life Saving a Life Member of the club.

(A) Clause 22 (i) of the Club By-Laws states as follows:

#### "Process

- Nominations shall be submitted on the prescribed nomination form to the Director of Administration at least sixty days (60) before the Annual General Meeting.
- (ii) The Director of Administration forwards the nomination(s) to the President who, along with the Life Member Representative forms a Life Member Committee to consider the nomination(s).
  - If the President is a nominee then the Life Member Representative is to be the Chairperson of the Life Member Committee.
  - The Life Membership Committee to consist of the President as Chairperson, Life Member Representative and two other Life Members.
- If the application is approved by the Life Member Committee, then the Board of Directors will be advised.
- (iv) The nomination is then voted on at the Annual General Meeting and must be approved by at least two thirds majority.

#### <u>Criteria:</u>

- (v) The nominee must fulfil one of the following criteria to be considered for Life Membership. 20 years Patrol Service (with a minimum of 20 hours per year) or
  - 15 years 100% patrol service, or
  - 15 years' service as a Director and/or a Manager position held within the Club AND the nominee should clearly have demonstrated a commitment to the growth and development of the Club, i.e. major achievement, special contributions, SLS Awards, leadership within the Club, competition and supporting documentation must be provided.
  - (B) The Life Member Committee having considered that Peter Roden qualifies under By-Law 22 (i) to be a Life Member of the Club has approved Peter Roden as Life Member as has so advised the board of directors of the Club.

MOTION: "That Peter Roden is hereby made a Life Member of the Club."

NOTE: A majority of two thirds of those present is required to carry the notion.


Our Nippers and families are welcome to renew their membership or register for Nippers on:

## SLS Pool Challenge 2018 with Marlee Przybyla (U13s)

On the 15th of July Nipper participants Marlee Przybyla, Zoe Vella, Claire Hogger, Chloe Sapsford, Jade Day, Dean Hogger and Spencer Morris represented Macs at the NSW SLS Pool Rescue Challenge.

Held at the Peninsular Leisure Centre (Woy Woy) our little club did fantastic among the major clubs, Terrigal, Umina, Avoca, Elouera, Newport and many more. We came home with some incredible results - winning points for MacMasters Beach SLSC. Not only is pool rescue a chance to represent our club it is also heaps of fun!

Macs participated in many events including the; 100m obstacle course, 200m obstacle course relay, 50m brick carry, 100m brick carry relay, 100m patient tow, 200m medley relay, 50m underwater fins and the line throw.

The **100m Obstacle Course** is an individual race where competitors swim 100m but have to swim under two obstacles. The obstacle is a bar with a net attached to it and competitors need to dive under the nets pushing off the bottom or dolphin kicking underneath.

U13s Girls Results: Chloe 21st | Claire 19th | Marlee 29th | Zoe 20th

U11s Boys Results: Dean 26th

The **200m Obstacle Course Relay** is a team event and consists of four people. Competitors do the same thing as the individual race but only swim 50m and going underneath the two obstacles each.

U13s Girls Results: Marlee, Claire, Chloe and Zoe 4th

The **50m Brick Carry** is an individual race. Competitors must swim 25m then dive down and retrieve a 3.5kg brick which is located in the middle of the pool. After retrieving the brick they must swim with one arm holding the brick on their back, stomach or by their side for the remaining 25m.

U13s Girls Results: Chloe 20th | Claire 10th | Marlee 26th | Zoe 27th

U11s Boys Results: Dean 28th

The **100m Brick Carry Relay** is a team event consisting of four people where the first person is located at the start of the pool with the brick waiting to push off the wall. The third person is at the other end and second and fourth are in the middle of the pool. Each competitor swims 25m passing the brick to the next person.

U13s Girls Results: Marlee, Claire, Zoe and Chloe 7th

The **100m Patient Tow** is a team event and consists of two competitors. The first person dives in wearing flippers and has a tube on their back, the second person is at the other end of the pool holding the edge. The first person swims 50m finishes and clips the second person into the tube and they swim back together with the first person dragging the second on their back kicking.

U13s Girls Results: Marlee and Chloe 4th | Zoe and Claire 15th

The **200m Medley Relay** is a team event and consisting of four competitors. The first and second swim 50m each one using fins, one not. The third person swims 50m with a tube on their back then the third person gives the sash to the fourth. The fourth person drags the third person while they kick.

U13s Girls Results: Marlee, Chloe, Zoe and Claire 10th

The **50m Underwater** event is an individual race where the competitor wears flippers and dives in the pool going underwater as far as they can. Once they come up they swim the rest of the way.

U13s Girls Results: Chloe 10th | Claire 19th | Marlee 23rd | Zoe 21st

U11s Boys Results: Dean 24th

The Line Throw is a team event, consisting of two people. The swimmer swims out to a barrier holding on with

one hand. Waiting for the whistle, the thrower then coils the rope up and attempts to throw it to the swimmer who is 10m away. If it doesn't reach them they recoil it and try again. If it does reach the swimmer, they then hold onto the rope and kicks while the thrower reels them in. There is a two minute time limit in this event!

Each month we will catch up with different Macs SLSC identities to find out why they are involved in our great Club and what makes them tick.


This month, let's chat with one of our Life Members, Vince Roberts.


