WILD WEATHER!

The beach was closed for several days due to big seas, poor water quality and lots of logs floating in the Ocean. Our patrols were on the beach through all the wild weather and a big thank you to everyone who made a contribution.

Unfortunately, some of our members suffered damage to their homes, our thoughts are with them for speedy repairs. The club house did not suffer any structural damage but

there was significant loss of electrical equipment due to power surges. The repair and replacement bill will be significant and the bad weather also caused a large drop in trading activity for the bar. The combined effect of this will directly affect the Club's budget performance for 2019/20.
