SP: Falafel wrap.


Preferred beverage from the Macs Beach Bar?

What a Kracka!


Two very lucky and deserving U13 nipper members had a surprise roadtrip north in March and took delivery of their new Kracka Racing Mals.

ALLEN DICKINSON - LIFE MEMBER 2000/01

Allen Dickinson was awarded Life Membership in 2000/2001 in recognition of his 19 years association and membership with MacMasters Beach Surf Club. During this time he was actively involved in all aspects of the Surf Life Saving movement.

As President he was very mindful of the Club's future and instrumental in setting forward a ten-year plan for the club to build on. The plan included Administration, Budgeting, Marketing, Maintenance, Sponsorship and Training. The club plans put in place at that time have been adopted, maintained and enhanced by following committees and because of this the Club is more successful financially, competitively and socially.

Allen passed away unexpectedly in 2001. In his memory 'The Allen Dickinson Foundation' was established, providing financial support to up-and-coming club competitors.
