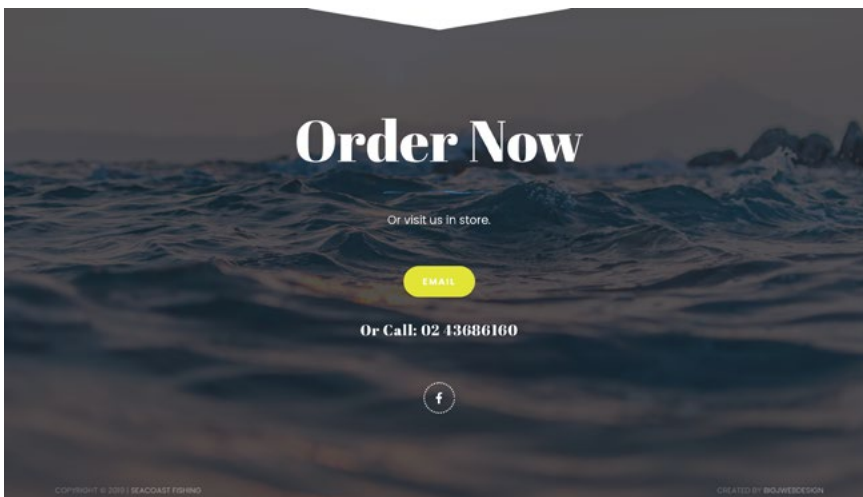

Population Changes, COVID and the impact on our Club

It might not be something we consider on a day to day basis, but population and demographics are critical for our club's future. Think about it - the pipeline of new members largely starts with Nippers and the recruitment of their parents into our club to fill countless voluntary roles - not to mention as patrolling members. In recent years, we've seen how changes in population have impacted clubs further up the coast.

2020 has been an extraordinary year. The media is full of articles about Sydneysiders buying property in the region, seeking a 'sea change' or a 'tree change'. Covid has meant that hard-pressed city workers have worked out they don't need to travel to the CBD to be productive.

So, what does that mean for our local area? And what might be the long-term impacts of changes to population driven by COVID? There's no one better to ask than the Club's major sponsor, Cathy Baker of Belle Property Central Coast - we caught up and had a chat ...

MH: So, Cathy, before Covid 19 struck us, were there any discernible changes in the 'new settlers' coming into our catchment area?

CB: *Prior to COVID19 new settlers into the area were predominantly downsizers however, since the pandemic and as you mentioned organisations seeing an increase in productivity as they transitioned to home office's we are now seeing younger families relocating for better quality of life.*

Due to travel restrictions we are also seeing an increase in holiday makers and investors picking up a holiday home for investment purposes that also serves them with great personal enjoyment. An additional key trend that we are seeing since lockdowns were enforced are families relocating to be closer to their loved ones which is really lovely to see and be a part of.

During COVID19 85% of our property purchasers have been holiday makers keeping their principal place of residence and utilising the additional home on the weekends. It has been wonderful for property prices although we are not expecting to lose our beautiful quaint character that we have in our area and community.

MH: During the height of Covid, it seemed like the beaches were swarming with families, and mostly fresh faces too, where did they come from?

CB: *That's a really interesting question as we see people settling here from all areas, not only city dwellers, the purchasers of 2 South Pacific Drive, Macmasters Beach have come from the Blue Mountains.*

They visited the area and fell in love, they had not stayed one night here prior to buying their new home and relocating and they are loving exploring the area and the coastal change.

MH: Has the renewed interest in 'holidaying at home' converted into people deciding to permanently settle in our area, and if so, what will be the net impact - more families or less?

CB: *More families, I think we are going to see more Sydney siders enjoying the area and making new traditions for their family holidays, looking for an authentic tranquil environment that is only a short drive away. In time some will sell their city dwelling and relocate permanently as they're are required less in the city.*

MH: Looking at the bigger picture, what do you think might be the long-term population trends for our area and what might be their impact on the club?

CB: *Macmasters SLSC is the perfect way for anyone relocating to make new connections and friendships and be a part of the community. I think the future of the club is strong.*

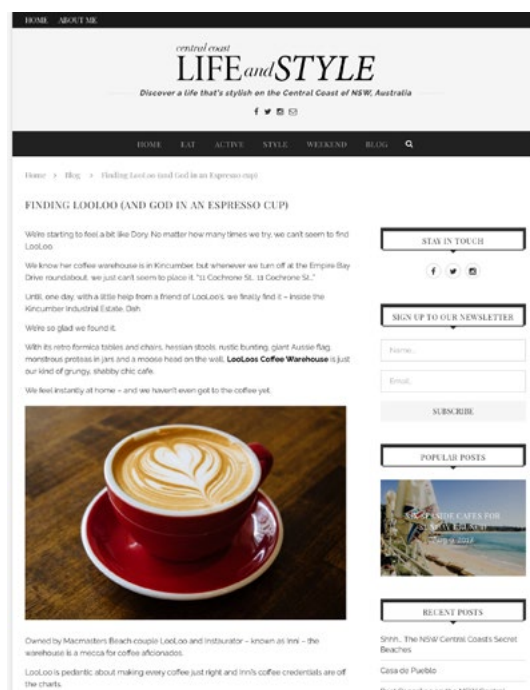

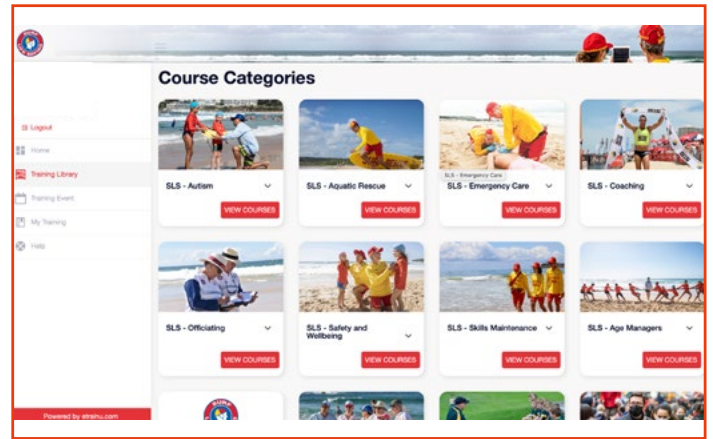
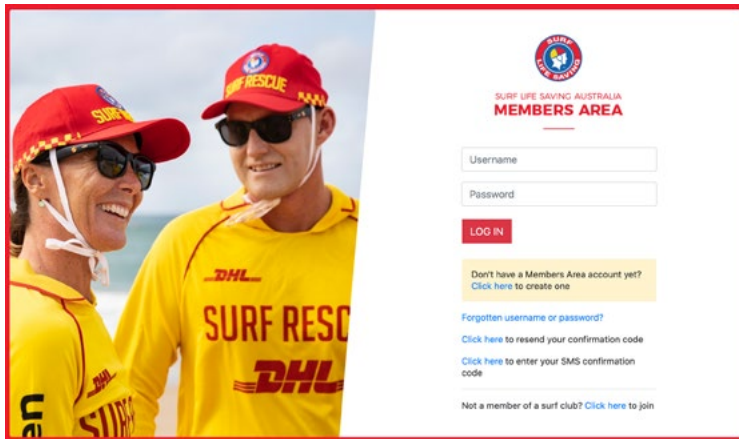

Education and Training *with Graham 'Jono' Johnston*

The 2021 season brings plenty of new changes to training and education as we adhere to the Covid 19 protocols. Here is an update regarding courses, training and requals:



SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE & SURF BRONZE MEDALLION:

Parents and members seeking to complete these awards need to be financial surf club members, and be registered on the SLSA Portal - click on the images to the right. The vast majority of this course can be conducted via eLearning found on the portal. The practical component can be completed whilst on surf patrol duty or during Nippers.

WATER SAFETY:

Please note that the basic requirement for completing voluntary water safety at club or competition level is completion of the Surf Rescue Certificate (see above).

REQUAL'S AND PROFICIENCIES:

These must be completed prior to the 30th December and for each award there is an online component on the SLSA portal that will require completion. Content Experts are allocated to each patrol to assess proficiency for each award - ask your Patrol Captain.

KEEN TO JOIN A PATROL?

Active members are always welcome to join our teams on the beach. The minimum requirement to join a rostered patrol is Radio Operations and or a current First Aid Certificate. Further training, if required can be completed on patrols.

ROOKIES ON PATROL!

Rookies are now rostered on patrols. Senior patrolling members are highly encouraged to be proactive with these junior members and actively engage in the teaching of surf and patrolling skills. All rookies require training in Radio Operations, a simple task, yet highly important in the case of an emergency.

TOURNIQUETS

Tourniquets, a life saving device in the case of major blood loss, are now included in the first aid kit. Training in the application of a tourniquet is compulsory during proficiencies and is included in the eLearning on the portal with a practical demonstration required.

Congratulations to both Claire and Spencer.

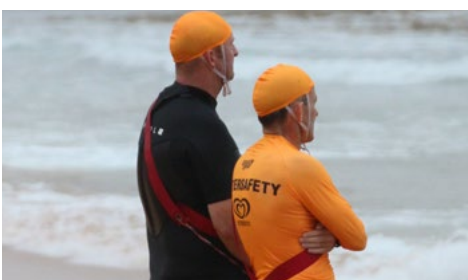


Water Safety for Adults - Practical Session
