
COVID-19 VACCINATION POLICY

Surf Life Saving NSW has issued the <u>Covid-19 Vaccination Policy</u> which applies to all surf clubs in NSW. The policy is included in full at the end of this edition of Point Break.

The key requirements are:

- from 23rd February 2022 all frontline volunteers must be fully vaccinated (2 doses), this includes Patrol Members, Facilitators, Trainers and Assessors.

- **by 31st October 2022** your **vaccination record must be lodged on Surfguard** *Please read the policy and make sure you comply.* If you are eligible for your booster shot, please book in and get yours. I have mine!

TSUNAMI SUNDAY

Education and Training with Lyn Drummond, Director of Education

It's been a very busy summer with beach attendances high on most days at MacMasters through January. So far this season we have done 405 preventative actions and almost 20 rescues so all the training and requals have certainly been worthwhile!

COASTAL DROWNING STATISTICS

Surf Lifesaving Australia reports that tragically, there have been 35 coastal drowning deaths this Summer (1 Dec 2021 - 23 Jan 2022) which is higher than both this time last year and the ten-year average for the same period, with thousands more people rescued or provided assistance by surf lifesavers and lifeguards.

RIPS

The rips at Macs are a big danger for inexperienced beach goers. Can you spot a rip? The five common signs of a rip current are:

 \rightarrow deeper darker-coloured water \rightarrow fewer breaking waves \rightarrow debris floating seaward

ightarrow a rippled appearance, surrounded by smoother water

→ foamy/discoloured sandy water extending beyond the surf zone.



Surf Life Saving NSW COVID-19 Vaccination POLICY

Title:	Surf Life Saving NSW COVID-19 Vaccination Policy – Members
Date:	20 January 2022
Responsible Portfolio:	Governance
Authority:	This Policy is made under clause 43 of the SLSNSW Constitution. It is binding on all Members of SLSNSW and is to be interpreted in accordance with the SLSNSW Constitution.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to facilitate the protection of the health and safety of members who attend and participate in front line volunteering activities at any of Surf Life Saving NSW's (SLSNSW) facilities, activities and services (including work in public areas) by requiring all such persons to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

This policy is in addition to other COVID Safe measures to protect public health and ensure the safety of all members, employees, industry and community partners, contractors and visitors, as well as the communities we live in and serve.

Application

This policy applies to SLSNSW members (or Surf Life Saving members visiting from other states) who:

- are undertaking Frontline Patrolling or Support Operations activity for a club, branch or SLSNSW.
- Undertake the delivery of training, facilitating and assessing activities for a club, branch or SLSNSW

Members who are undertaking tasks related to SLSNSW business activities are included in the Surf Life Saving NSW COVID -19 Vaccination Policy – Employees Policy.

Definitions

In this policy, the following terms have the meaning as set out below:

Approved Vaccine means any COVID-19 vaccination that have been provisionally registered for use in Australia by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA).

Frontline Volunteering Activity means involvement as any of the following:

- I. Surf Life Saving patrolling activity being undertaken by a proficient member that requires the member to be the holder of a SLS Lifesaving, Emergency Care or Powercraft Award (including holders of: Bronze Medallion; SRC; ARTC, IRB Driver, IRB Crew, RWC Operator; radio operator, UAV Operator, ORB, JRB)
- II. Support Operations Personnel



III. Facilitators, Assessors, Trainers

Fully Vaccinated means having obtained the manufacturer's recommended initial dosage of any Approved Vaccine. For example, where a two-dose schedule is recommended by the manufacturer, a person will be considered fully vaccinated when they have received both doses of the vaccine. Note, at this time, Boosters do not form part of fully vaccinated requirements.

Recognised Contraindication means a Medical Condition or reaction to an Approved Vaccine that is recognised by the manufacturer of that vaccine and has been confirmed and documented by an approved medical practitioner.

Requirement to be vaccinated

As of **23 February 2022**, it will be a requirement for any Frontline Volunteer Patrolling activity, Support Operations activity or training, assessing and facilitating activity that the Member must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19, unless they have been granted an exemption by SLSNSW in accordance with this policy. Vaccination must be undertaken on the advice of an accredited health practitioner (including health practitioners at any authorised COVID-19 vaccination centres).

All those undertaking these activities will be required to provide evidence acceptable to SLSNSW of being fully vaccinated.

From **23 February 2022** we will accept for these purposes proof of vaccination through the Service NSW app, your COVID-19 Digital Certificate, or if you do not have one, your Immunisation History Statement. These documents should be sighted by the supervisor at the SLS activity you are undertaking (eg Patrol Captain, Support Operations Coordinator, Club President or delegate)

Note: We are currently working with Surf Life Saving Australia to make upgrades to Surfguard and the Members Portal. We expect this work to be completed in coming months and you will be required to lodge your 12-digit COVID-19 Digital Certificate number by **31 October 2022**. We will advise members when this facility becomes available.

If you require assistance lodging your 12-digit COVID-19 Digital Certificate number, please email <u>covid19@surflifesaving.com.au</u> for assistance.

Exemptions

We understand that not all members will be able to receive an Approved Vaccine, due to medical conditions for which there is a Recognised Contraindication to receiving any of the Approved Vaccines.

Any members who have such a medical condition are required to provide a medical contraindication certificate. SLSNSW reserves the right to contact the issuing medical practitioner to verify the authenticity of any such medical contraindication certificate.

Any member who is unable to become fully vaccinated for any other reason, including by reason of a sincerely held religious belief, religious practice or religious observance, must email <u>covid19@surflifesaving.com.au</u> prior to 23 February 2022. Requests for an exemption will be considered by SLSNSW on a case-by-case basis.

In order to ensure the health and safety of members at SLSNSW's activities and events, members granted an exemption may be subject to conditions or restrictions related to their role.

Information provided to SLSNSW

Any information provided to SLSNSW in accordance with this policy will be treated confidentially and will be used only for determining compliance with this policy,



Any Member who provides information to SLSNSW in accordance with this policy is expected to provide accurate and truthful information to us. Failure to do so will be considered serious misconduct and may result in breaching the SLS Code of Conduct which may result in disciplinary action as per the Complaint Resolution Policy.

Obtaining information about vaccination

We advise you in the first instance to consult with your accredited health practitioner about any concerns you may have in relation to receiving an Approved Vaccine, including the process for obtaining an Approved Vaccine.

Compliance

While we hope that all members will comply with this policy to keep themselves, each other and the public safe, we do recognise and respect the fact that some will choose not to be vaccinated.

Unfortunately, this may mean that those participating in Frontline Volunteer Patrolling; Support Operations or Training, Assessing and Facilitating activities who fail to comply with this policy will be subject to restrictions around what roles and tasks they can do as a Member of SLSNSW.

If a Member is not fully vaccinated, we reserve the right to refuse access to Surf Life Saving Frontline Volunteer Patrolling; Support Operations or Training, Assessing and Facilitating Activities

Operation of this policy

SLSNSW will be continuously monitoring and assessing the operation of this policy in line with the latest information from Government and health authorities. SLSNSW may amend, withdraw or replace this policy from time to time at its sole discretion.
