Kokoda Trail, PNG with Alec and Calum Walters

From the 14th-24th of September, we travelled over to Papua New Guinea to complete the Kokoda Trail. We stayed in a hotel on the 14th as a final relaxation before our trek began.

The next morning, we were up and out at 7 to get to the airstrip at 7:30. We loaded our packs into the small, single prop plane and prepared for the next 8 days of walking. We took off on our 30min flight to Kokoda with minimal turbulence. We had a very smooth landing on the grass airstrip of Kokoda and were greeted by the locals at the airport which was half a shed. We were then briefed and then began our hike.

Stopping off at the Kokoda museum and memorial, most of the walk for the first day was on a fire trail of small incline with trucks and locals passing us. We reached our camp for the first night on a small ledge looking back across the valley to Kokoda.

Day 2 was more intense up and down hiking through dense rainforest. It was a better temperature as we were sheltered by the trees so that helped with the more difficult walking terrain. We reached camp and we were all drenched with sweat. We cooled off before passing a footy with the local kids which turned in to playing a game.

Day 3 we walked past a primary school where some of the kids walking with us attended. We had a steep downhill with lots of falls down to a creek crossing before heading back up the other side of the valley. We made a quick stop at a waterfall for a swim then were keen on getting to the village early as this was the village that most of the guides lived in. We were greeted with flower necklaces and treated to lunch with some food the locals had prepared for us. We then went down to the oval and kicked the footy and played volleyball.

Day 4 and 5 were up and down with less tree cover so the heat was more intense. Nice cool off swim in the river after to soothe the muscles.

Day 6 we stopped at Brigade hill for some history. We then ventured down for night 6 at the lowest point of the trek. We had set up our tents just before it rained. The last couple days were less intense so we got to enjoy the walk more and take in the scenery around us.

Our last night was the best by far. We had an amazing campsite by the river where we swam for a few hours with our guides throwing the footy around.

It was sad saying goodbye as we had had such an amazing experience on the track.

Thank you to everyone involved in making such a great experience possible. Definitely recommend it. The Duke of Ed program has been amazing, and what better qualifying trip for Gold than the Kokoda Track!

SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE


Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate training has started with over 20 members signing up. We are always happy to welcome and encourage any other members to join our training.
